Marina Abramović

*1946, woman (pronouns: she/her)

Marina Abramović is a Serbian artist and pioneer of performance art. She is famous for her critical, ruthlessly honest, and physically demanding art actions. In her work, she repeatedly questions hierarchies and power structures.

She stood up for the interests of Black people in Germany and her poems also dealt with Afro-German identity and life in racist structures. The first Black German Literature Prize was named after her (May Ayim Award).

After the shift to the right in the mid-1990s, which was accompanied by attacks on her person, she withdrew from professional politics but continued to work tirelessly on feminist and socialist issues.

*1976, intersex (pronouns: he/him)

Alex Jürgen is an inter-activist who publicly spoke about himself being intersex in a 2006 film "Tintenfischalarm" by Elisabeth Scharang. He is also a founding and honorary member of VIMÖ (association of intersex people in Austria, exists since 2014, https://vimoe.at/) In 2016, Alex Jürgen applied for an additional gender entry in addition to "male" and "female". In 2019, he was the first person in Austria to have an "X" in his passport and a "diverse" on his birth certificate.

Klaus Wowereit was the mayor of Berlin for 13 years until his retirement in 2014. He was a member of the SPD (Social Democratic Party of Germany) and one of the first well-known German politicians to speak about his homosexuality publicly for which he was celebrated as a role model by many homosexual people, both inside and outside politics. His statement "I'm gay — and that's a good thing!" is still quoted a lot. Wowereit was with his partner, who has passed away recently, for over 20 years.
